#### Children, Adults at Dances

I love seeing families at contra dances and children experiencing dance as a normal part of life. However, certain behaviors of both children and adults can be a danger to others at the dance. I think these behaviors should change.

A person not dancing should stay off the dance floor. Dancers are not there to be an obstacle course.

Children dancing should be respected as dancers and not treated as playthings. They should be danced with in as normal a position as their skill and size allow. Do not pick them up and swing them around—it is a danger to other dancers and the child. In addition, such behavior disorients the child, making it harder to learn the dance and teaching them the wrong thing. I have had the unfortunate experience of suddenly having to catch a child who had been taught to leap into the arms of the dancers. One unexpected missile of a child can damage my back for a month.
