English Country Dance (ECD) is similar to contra dance, but different. Similar enough to be familiar, but different enough to be interesting.

Different how? ECD, in general, has less physical contact but more eye contact. ECD can be more mentally challenging. There is an amazing variety within ECD: in the music, meter, mood, attitude, tempo, formation and figures. ECD is often graceful in a gracious way, calling to mind the elegant balls you've probably seen in film versions of Jane Austen novels.

English Country dancing comes to Ventura beginning January 8. New dancers are enthusiastically welcomed. The series continues on the second Monday of every month from 7 to 9 PM.
